This year, America's National Parks Service turns 100 years old. Water For People Report – Lisa Pezzino, SRT Consultants

2015 was another great year for the BAWWA Water For People Committee! We raised \$12,908 for Water For People in support of water and sanitation improvements around the world. The following events and activities contributed to the success of our committee in 2015:

ANNUAL WATER FOR PEOPLE AUCTION

We had an extraordinary auction in November, raising \$2,670! There were some impressive donations for the auction, and special mention is certainly due to Tim Karlstrand, Judith Millard, and Vern Phillips who offered 24 hours of their home improvement services - in addition to \$500 of materials (donated by Harris) - to the winning bidder. This item was auctioned off at \$1,200 after a very competitive bidding war.


Total Money Raised: \$2,670

3rd ANNUAL WATER FOR PEOPLE FILM EVENT

On September 23rd, the BAWWA Water For People Committee organized the 3rd Annual Bay Area Water For People Film Event, which was supported by \$9,400 in sponsorships, and hosted ninety-five people for cocktails, appetizers, and a documentary about humanity's relationship with water. 

You will not want to miss this opportunity to tour one of the Bay Area's newest and most advanced water treatment facilities! Completed in July 2014, the Silicon Valley Advanced Water Purification Center, the largest of its kind in Northern California, is the focal point of the Santa Clara Valley Water District's recycled

water expansion. The facility receives secondary-treated effluent from the neighboring San Jose-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility, and processes the treated effluent through three additional treatment processes (microfiltration, reverse osmosis and ultraviolet disinfection) to produce up to 8 million gallons of purified water. The purified water is blended with the recycled water supply produced at the regional wastewater facility to enhance its quality and expand its usage via the South Bay Water Recycling System.

Presentation: California's Groundwater and the Path to Sustainability

CHRIS BONDS, PG, CHg

Senior Engineering Geologist, California Department of Water Resources

Chris Bonds is a Senior Engineering Geologist with the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) in Sacramento, California. He currently manages DWRs Future Water Supply Program which focuses on groundwater monitoring, management, and modeling in the Sacramento Valley. Chris is also actively involved in significant statewide DWR efforts including the Drought Management Operations Center and the Sustainable Groundwater Management Program. He has 23 years of geology and groundwater experience in consulting and public service and is a licensed Professional Geologist and Certified Hydrogeologist in California. Chris received his Bachelor of Science in Geology from Cal State University, Northridge (1992) and Masters of Science in Geology from Cal State University, Los Angeles (1998).

ABSTRACT: California's Groundwater and the Path to Sustainability

Groundwater basins provide cost-effective local water storage and, if well managed, will make communities more resilient against drought and climate change. Some regions do not manage groundwater sustainably, resulting in problems such as overdraft and land subsidence. Thirty-million Californians rely on groundwater for some of their supply and on average, it provides about 40 percent of the state's annual water supply. In dry years, groundwater provides about 60 percent of the state's water supply and some areas are 100 percent dependent on groundwater for their supply.

The Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA), signed into law by Governor Jerry Brown on September 16, 2014, is the most significant water law in over 100 years and puts California on the path to sustainable management of all its water resources. This new law, which became effective January 1, 2015, creates a framework for sustainable, local groundwater management for the first time in California history. A central feature of SGMA is the recognition that groundwater management in California is best accomplished locally. Local agencies now have the power to assess the conditions of the state's 127 high- and medium-priority groundwater basins and take the necessary steps to bring those basins into balance over the 20+ year SGMA implementation period (2020-2042).



Merge and continue onto CA-237 W for approximately 0.6 miles, and then take the Zanker Road exit. Turn right onto Zanker Road and proceed north on Zanker Road for approximately 0.5 miles. The facility is located on your right.

From East Bay (via I-880 S): From I-880 S, take the CA-237 W exit toward Mountain View. Continue on CA-237 W for approximately 0.5 miles, and then take the Zanker Road exit. Turn right onto Zanker Road and proceed north on Zanker Road for approximately 0.5 miles. The facility is located on your right.

From Peninsula (via US-101 S): From US-101 S, merge onto CA-237 E toward Alviso/Milpitas. Continue on CA-237 E for approximately 5.5 miles, and then take the Zanker Road exit. Turn left onto Zanker Road and proceed north on Zanker Road for approximately 0.5 miles. The facility is located on your right.







From Tour Site: Head south on Zanker Road for approximately 1.1 miles. Turn right onto E. Tasman Drive. Continue on E. Tasman Drive for approximately 2.1 miles. Turn right onto Centennial Blvd, and then another left onto Stars and Stripes Drive. The facility is located on the right.

From South Bay (via US-101 N): From US-101 N, take the Great America Parkway (toward Bowers Avenue) exit. Merge right onto Great American Parkway and continue for approximately 0.5 miles. Turn right onto Tasman Drive and continue for approximately 0.5 miles. Turn left onto Centennial Blvd, and then another left onto Stars and Stripes Drive. The facility is located on the right.

From East Bay (via I-880 S): From I-880 S, take the CA-237 W exit toward Mountain View. Continue on CA-237 W for approximately 1.8 miles, and then take the North First Street exit. Turn left onto N. 1st Street and proceed south for approximately 0.5 miles. Turn right on Vista Montana, and then another right on W Tasman Drive. Continue on W. Tasman Drive for approximately 0.9 miles. Turn right onto Centennial Blvd, and then another left onto Stars and Stripes Drive. The facility is located on the right.

From Peninsula (via US-101 S): From US-101 S, merge onto CA-237 E toward Alviso/Milpitas. Continue on CA-237 E for approximately 3.3 miles, and then take the Great America Parkway (toward Lafayette St) exit. Turn right onto Great American Pkwy and proceed south for approximately 0.8 miles. Turn left onto Tasman Drive. Continue on W. Tasman Drive for approximately 0.5 miles. Turn left onto Centennial Blvd, and then another left onto Stars and Stripes Drive. The facility is located on the right.
